The Township Paving program for this year will include Laurel Drive and Shepard Road. The project has been delayed multiple times due to plant breakdowns and weather conditions. The section of Shepard Road that will be completed is from the railroad tracks to US Route 84. Traffic will be maintained on both of these routes during construction. This area will be done similarly to the previous paving on Shepard with widening the road on each side as well as drainage improvements near SR 84.

Lake County Engineer, Alan L. Exley, PE, PS has announced that the **Blair Road Retaining Wall Replacement** project is set to begin on Monday, July 14th requiring all traffic to follow the posted detour. The section of wall to be replaced is located approximately 0.5 miles south of River Road and just west of Blair Landing Park. Weather permitting, Blair Road will be closed July 14th with project completion scheduled for October 17, 2025. The project was awarded to Alan Stone Co. Of Vincent, Ohio. The work covered by the plans and specifications includes replacement of approximately 400 ft of retaining wall and replacement of adjacent pavement, guardrail and drainage.

AMERICAN LEGION

On Memorial Day, we honored two local heroes who made the ultimate sacrifice defending our great nation.

Sgt Eugene Pizzino II, United States Air Force graduated from Riverside High School and served as a Load Master aboard C-130 Hercules military transport aircraft. During a return flight from Vietnam on March 8th 1969, the C-130 he was aboard crashed in Taiwan due to poor weather. Although he survived the crash, he succumbed to his injuries on March 16th 1969. He was 21 years old. He was survived by his wife Mary Ellen (Meglan) Pizzino who graduated from Perry High School in 1965, and their two young daughters Wendy and Tracy. His oldest daughter Wendy (Pizzino) McPherson was present at the ceremony and laid a brick in honor of her father's enduring service.

World War II MIA Private Henry Kalinowski, United States Marine Corps graduated from Ashtabula High School in 1938 and served in the Marine Detachment aboard USS ARIZONA. At approximately 7:55 am on December 7th 1941, General Quarters was sounded and the crew and the embarked Marines raced to their battle stations. At about 8:05 am, Private Kalinowski was at his battle station as loader for one of the forward 8 inch casement gun batteries. At approximately 8:10 am, one of the Japanese armor-piercing bombs struck ARIZONA near forward gun mount number two detonating her forward ammunition magazines. Private Kalinowski was among the 1,177 ARIZONA crew members killed that day. Several family members were present for the ceremony and Henry's nephew, Bill Kalinowski laid a brick in honor of his uncle's enduring service.



- (3) A zoning certificate shall not be required for a garage, yard or estate sale.
- (4) All displayed merchandise, tables, tents, signs and other paraphernalia associated with such sales shall be removed immediately upon completion of the event.

Perry Village, Township, and JEDD Collaborate on Promising Data Center Development

PERRY VILLAGE — Perry Village, Perry Township, and the Perry Joint Economic Development District (JEDD) are working closely together on a proposed data center project that could transform the long-unused Champion Farm property into a high-tech economic engine for the region.

After sitting idle for over 30 years, the proposed development offers significant financial benefits for residents, schools, and local governments—all while preserving the community's rural character and quality of life.

A Cooperative Approach to Economic Growth

Champion Farm, once a thriving nursery business, has been unused for more than three decades despite repeated efforts to attract new development. While listed for sale, the property recently drew interest from a data center developer, prompting local leaders to evaluate this new opportunity collaboratively.

Officials from Perry Village, Perry Township, and the JEDD have joined forces to explore the project's potential. Together, they're working to ensure the development meets strict standards for design, noise, lighting, and environmental impact while delivering strong economic returns.

"This is truly a team effort," Village officials said. "Perry Village, the Township, and the JEDD are committed to creating a project that benefits the entire community."

Sound and Lighting: Preserving Peace and Night Skies

Residents often worry about noise and light pollution from large developments. Village officials emphasize that modern data centers are much quieter than traditional industrial facilities. The proposed facility will include noise-reducing technology and will operate well within newly established sound limits designed to protect nearby neighborhoods, businesses, and the adjacent cemetery.

Village leaders visited New Albany, Ohio — home to many data centers — where they measured sound levels and spoke with residents living near these facilities. The consensus: modern data centers operate quietly and blend seamlessly into the community.

Lighting is also tightly regulated. Perry Village has adopted "Night Sky" standards requiring all exterior lighting to be shielded and directed downward, eliminating glare and preserving the community's rural feel. There will be no stadium-style lights on the property.

Responsible Water Usage and Infrastructure

Water usage is another important concern for the community. The proposed data center will connect to Lake County's water system and will not rely on groundwater wells. Officials assure residents that the facility's water use will fit within existing allocations and will not cause reductions in water pressure.

Modern data centers use significantly less water than older designs thanks to advanced cooling technologies. Many developers also participate in water-restoration initiatives to protect local resources.

Residents should not expect issues like low water pressure. In fact, infrastructure improvements linked to the project could enhance service reliability for nearby homes and businesses.

Power Supply: No Impact on Local Reliability

Another key question from residents is whether the data center will cause power shortages or more frequent outages. Village officials emphasize that the data center will connect directly to the high-voltage transmission lines already running through the Champion Farm property.

The power supply for the data center will come from the regional transmission grid—not from the lower-voltage distribution lines that serve homes and businesses. There will be no loss of power or increased outages for local residents. First Energy, the regional power provider, has confirmed that the data center can be served without affecting residential electric service.

In other communities in Ohio, like New Albany, data centers operate from dedicated power lines and have not led to higher residential rates or disruptions in service.

Traffic Kept Off Village Streets

Unlike traditional industrial developments, data centers generate minimal traffic. Village officials note that the proposed facility would produce only about one-fifth of the traffic typically associated with industrial sites. All construction and operational traffic will access the property directly from Route 20, ensuring heavy vehicles stay off Village streets.

Substantial Benefits for Schools, Residents, and Local Governments

Financially, the project represents a significant opportunity for Perry Village and the surrounding community:

- Data centers bring major capital investment and new tax revenues.
- They generate real estate taxes, payroll taxes, and income taxes, strengthening local finances and reducing reliance on any single taxpayer.
- Between 2017 and 2021, data centers in Ohio contributed over \$2.6 billion in state and local tax revenues.

Perry Local School District stands to gain considerable new revenue from the data center development. Beyond financial support, the project also brings potential community investment and partnership opportunities, allowing the district to benefit from increased resources and support for local programs and infrastructure.

Local Job Creation

Construction of the data center will bring high-quality jobs to the region, employing local contractors, electricians, engineers, and inspectors. Once operational, the center is expected to provide approximately 175 permanent positions, with salaries ranging from \$50,000 to \$200,000 annually.

In addition, the facility will support about 700 indirect jobs in the region across services, maintenance, technology, and related industries.

Infrastructure Improvements for the Community

Data centers require advanced technology infrastructure, including high-speed fiber networks and reliable electrical systems. Communities like New Albany, Ohio, have experienced significant upgrades from such projects, benefitting both businesses and residents with faster internet speeds and stronger utility services.

Perry Village officials believe similar improvements could come to Perry, enhancing services for residents.

Commitment to Transparency and Public Engagement

Perry Village, Perry Township, and the JEDD have hosted numerous public meetings and presentations about the project, involving stakeholders such as the Village Council, Planning Commission, Township Trustees, Perry School District, and the JEDD Board. All parties remain dedicated to a transparent process and ensuring residents have ample opportunity for input.

"This is a significant decision for our community's future," officials said. "By working together, Perry Village, Perry Township, and the JEDD are focused on making sure this project benefits everyone."

A Transformative Opportunity

The proposed data center represents the first viable plan for the Champion Farm property in more than three decades. Local leaders believe it offers a unique chance to bring new jobs, modern infrastructure, and financial security to the region—all while protecting the peaceful, small-town character of Perry Village. Public discussions will continue as the project advances through planning and review stages. We have a Town Hall Meeting scheduled for **Thursday**, **July 24th at 6 pm** at the Perry Community Center, 2800 Perry Park Road, Perry, OH 44081.




