From the desk of...

We have received multiple complaints regarding speeding vehicles in some of our subdivisions. We intend to utilize our speed trailer. As the warmer months bring more activity to our streets, we kindly ask that everyone remain vigilant and considerate when driving through our neighborhoods. Many of our residents have children and pets who enjoy playing outside, and we all want to ensure their safety. The Yard Waste drop-off facility has **re-opened** as of **Saturday**, **April 5**th. The hours are Wednesdays from noon-3 pm and Saturdays 8:00 am - 2:00 pm. Just a reminder - the facility will only accept residential drop-offs, no commercial haulers or landscapers.

The Spring Trash Drop-Off will be held on Saturday, April 26th from 8:00 am - 2:00 pm at the Webb Road Service Garage located at 4720 Webb Road. As in the past, Service Department employees will be there to help unload. ID's will be checked. Please refer to the enclosed flyer for details.

We are looking forward to the Perry Township Summer Concert Series in July. The concerts will begin Wednesday, July 9th and run through Wednesday, August 20st from 7 pm - 9 pm. The concerts are made possible by contributions from local businesses and are free to the public. The band schedule has been set; please refer to the enclosed flyer. Plan to bring your lawn chair or blanket and join us for these concerts. Concessions are available for purchase at Break by the Lake.

The recently enacted **House Bill 315**, effective April 2, 2025 introduces significant changes to township public notice requirements. Townships will have additional options for publishing public notices, thus providing potential cost savings, and better communication with residents. Ohio Law requires public bodies, like townships, to give appropriate notice of their meetings. Townships that have their own website can place all public notice requirements on their website to fulfill the required notice obligations. Please visit our website to stay informed of upcoming public notices/meetings.

On May 6th, Ohio voters will be asked to vote on Issue 2- the Renewal of the State Capital Improvement Program. Voter approval of State Issue 2 will allow issuance of general obligation bonds up to \$250 million per year over 10 years to fund grants and loans for local infrastructure improvements across the State of Ohio and will create an estimated 35,000 construction jobs. Issue 2 relies on existing state revenues and does not raise your taxes.

Since Ohio voters first approved the program in 1987, it has provided funding for more than 19,000 critical infrastructure projects and upgrades to local roads and bridges, wastewater treatment systems, water supply systems, solid waste disposal facilities, and stormwater and sanitary collection, storage and treatment facilities across all 88 counties. In the current 10-year cycle, \$2.3 billion has been awarded to 1,084 local governments for 4,490 projects benefitting municipalities, counties, townships, and other subdivisions across the state.

Warmer weather will soon be upon us!

For many, warmer weather can mean yard work and spring clean-up. It should also be a time of considering fire safety around the house! By working fire safety into your springtime routine, you can keep your loved ones safe.



Clean out dryer vents

At the minimum, dryer vents need to be cleaned out at least once a year. You should also make sure that the air exhaust vent pipe (outside your house) is not restricted and the flap opens when the dryer is running.

Inspect your grill

Before you host your first springtime barbecue, make sure your grill is working correctly. Give it a full inspection, checking for grease or fat buildup, spider webs, and any other nests or debris. If you use a gas grill, ensure the gas hose is not dry rotting or leaking.



Properly dispose of yard waste

Dead branches, pine needles, fallen leaves and pulled weeds can be fuel for a fire. Remove all dead plants and other flammable materials at least 5 feet from around your house.

Please remember that Ohio has an **OPEN BURNING BAN** for the months of March, April, and May between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.



Replace smoke detector batteries

Spring is a great time to replace the batteries in all of your smoke detectors. Test each detector (smoke or CO) to ensure they're all working, and take some time to review your fire escape plan. If you need fresh batteries or new smoke detectors please contact us to learn about our smoke detector program and fire prevention programs.

This year, make fire and life safety a part of your spring-clean up routine.

PERRY CEMETERIES



The Service Department will be doing their spring cleanup of the cemeteries - grading driveways and disposing of decorations that were relocated by winter winds. We would appreciate all Christmas decorations be removed by April 15th.

Foundations will be poured in May. All foundation orders received by April 30th will be included and ready for Memorial Day. We also pour foundations in August and again in early November, so there will be two more opportunities to get them in this year.

Any planting must be approved by myself or Administrator Karen Sundy. Karen can be reached at (440) 259-5140 and my number is listed below. Please remember that planting must be **only in the stone line** and must be within 12" of the headstone. Planting of trees on graves is NOT allowed. Over time, the roots will inevitably heave the headstones and most likely interfere with future burials. Planting and decorations in the middle of graves will be removed.

Please contact Jen at the Township office for an order form if you're interested in purchasing a commemorative brick for a family member or friend who has served in the military. Cost is \$40 each. Bricks are placed at the Veterans Memorial in Center Road Cemetery.

US Route 20 Project update and timeline

The US Route 20 Project will be entering into **Perry in 2025**. The project includes major rehabilitation of the road including minor widening and drainage replacement. The main objective for **2025** will be to replace 2 large culverts (one near E. Dake Plumbing and Heating and the one near Red Mill Golf). As you have noticed, they have been working to clear the trees and vegetation the entire length of the job. Placement of temporary pavement will be put on the northside of US Route 20 between Townline Road and Center Road will also be in 2025. The schedule (as it stands today):



2026- Construction of Townline Road to Center Road, including culvert replacement near West Orchards.

2027-Construction of Center Road to Lane Road, including culvert replacement across from the LC Dog Shelter.

2028-Lane Road to the Route 20/Route 2 split. Tentative completion date of October of 2028.

As with any major construction project, there will be frustrations in the traffic flow. Traffic will be maintained during this project. The area in Madison has been completed and the roads are wonderful to travel.

ZONING

Welcome Spring!

Everyone is busy planning and getting ready to be outside. We have already been busy issuing zoning permits, mostly for sheds and fences so far.

- Just a reminder, if you are planning a Shed, Deck, Pool, Additions, or Fences, please contact us to arrange for the proper permitting. If in doubt, please contact us at 440-259-5140 so we can give you the correct information.
- Last year, the Zoning Commission worked to update the Township Zoning
 Resolution. This included review and additions and clarifications to Definitions. Also new zoning was
 added regarding Electric Vehicle Charging Stations, Food Trucks, and Ground Mounted Solar Panels
 for both Residential and Commercial/Industrial districts. The Zoning Resolution can be viewed on the
 Township Website under the Zoning Department.
- In November, we did a sign clean up around the Township, as many businesses were putting out advertising signs on various street corners and utility poles. The Businesses were contacted and advised of the zoning codes and violations below. All were cooperative and understanding.



Section 409.05 G1: No signs shall be attached to utility poles, street signs, or traffic control poles.

Section 409.05 G2: No signs shall be located within or shall obstruct any public right of way.

Section 409.05 G5: No off-premises signs shall be permitted.

- With Spring we have seen some new signs popping up. We ask that if you observe any signs in violation of the above zoning codes, please contact the Township offices so we can address the issue.
- Also, as the weather gets nicer, please look around and work to clean up any junk or debris that might be in the yard. The Township will have the semi-annual trash drop off on April 26. (see info in this edition) Gather it up and drop it off for a no cost dump for you. Perry will look a little better thanks to your efforts.

ATTENTION BUSINESS OWNERS: The Township has recently updated zoning for Signage regarding Feather Banners. Previously, these were not allowed, however we have put in new zoning to allow under certain conditions. The update is in the on-line Zoning Resolution on the Township website. You can also contact the Zoning Department for information and directions.



CLEAN-UP GUIDELINES

- 1. ID's will be checked. (Drivers license or utility bill).
- 2. No metal over 4 ft. in length (metal collection at Road Garage)
 No containers or boxes over 50 pounds
- 3. Unacceptable items: batteries, leaves, brush, yard waste, hazardous materials, liquid paint, dead animals, propane tanks, gas tanks & regular household garbage.
- 4. No engine blocks or heavy automobile parts
- 5. Items such as shingles, plasterboard, etc. must be boxed or in a container.
- 6. Items containing freon will **NOT** be collected.
- 7. NO TIRES WILL BE COLLECTED
- 8. Service Department employees will be there to assist with unloading.

PERRY HISTORICAL SOCIETY



The clocks have sprung forward and we at the Historical Society have also sprung into action. The MIA POW monument is taking shape in front of the museum; driving by you can see the wonderful progress being made. More than 4,000 Ohioans remain missing in action or were taken as prisoners of war since the beginning of WWI. No headstones nor American flags fly above their final resting place. Did you know Clara Barton, the founder of the American Red Cross worked for the War department after the

A reminder that **Mark Gilson**, former Perry Nurseryman and resident, will present the program "Lake County and Perry Nurseries" on April 26th at 7PM at the museum. Mark has such a wealth of knowledge regarding our nurseries both past and present. You can read some of the history in his North Perry Newsletters dated 2024. Doors will open at 6:30PM and refreshments will be served.

Please stop by the museum after the Memorial Day Parade to enjoy new veteran displays and learn some interesting history of our Perry community. Read about the famous **Duke The Hero Dog**, an English Collie who helped save part of downtown Perry on Main Street during the "The Great Fire Of 1909". Refreshments will be served.

I came across the following article in our archives dated May 30th, 1999 and written by Sally Malone: A great lady of Perry graced the Memorial Day Parade May 30th,1999, on Main Street (see photo below). Miriam Moore Champion, known as "The Blue Lady", is approaching her 100th birthday(August 25). Sporting a tasteful blue straw hat(prepared by the convertible driver Arlene Lawrence), she was delighted by the crowds attending the parade and the ceremony that followed at Veteran's Park. Mrs. Champion taught elementary school in Perry. She was also known as the "Tootsie Roll Lady" for the treats she once awarded to United Methodist Church children after Sunday services. As always, our meetings are held the second Saturday of each month at the Manchester West Building at 10:00AM. Refreshments are served and all are welcome to attend. Scouting USA...We're not just for Boys anymore!

Scouting USA (formerly Boy Scouts of America) is open to all- Boys, Girls, and their parents as well!

For 115 years, countless Perry youth have benefitted from their membership and participation in our Troop 71. Amongst their ranks are today's leaders in business, military, and public service. We are quickly approaching our 40th Eagle Scout, each of which has benefitted the community with a substantial service project.



Six years ago, Boy Scouts began admitting girls, allowing for the formation of separate girls and boys troops. Local residents took the initiative to organize Perry's first Girl Troop, and that troop produced Perry's first female eagle scout just a few years later.

Last year, our troop was admitted into the Combined Troop Pilot Program allowing us to operate as one under a single committee and adult leadership team. This has worked out really well for us and we hope to continue as a Combined Troop at the conclusion of the pilot. Tim Johnson is the Scoutmaster of Perry's Combined Troop.

With this exciting new opportunity, the troop faces new challenges. Our Two Deep Youth Protection Policy mandates that there always be two adults present when in contact with a Scout. Put another way, if we do not have at least one adult female (over 21) in attendance then our female scouts can not participate in meetings, outings, etc. With girls on the Eagle Trail, it is important that we support them in their Scouting pursuits.
